

UNIVERSITY COUNSELLING POLICIES

The School Transcript

GSIS provides universities a record of internal progress, nonstandardised grades, as well as formal public examination grades awarded over the last four years of Secondary school. Students are graded from the start of Year 10 (Grade 9) based on the IGCSE criteria that apply to their final examinations two years later, reflecting progress during that time. A student awarded C grades in Year 10 or 11 very often will achieve A and A* grades in the final examinations. In languages, many students at GSIS take IGCSEs and some AS levels at least one year early. This will be noted on the transcript.

Due to our reporting calendar, first semester transcripts will include September and mid year predicted IB grades. A second semester transcript with internal progress grades will not be available until March.

U.S. Admissions Testing

Our students do not receive any internal exam preparation for the SAT, ACT, or for any aptitude tests required by U.K. universities. They are expected to study independently.

University Applications

GSIS will only support up to 10 university applications per student, and we advise them to use this allowance judiciously.

IGCSEs

In Years 10 and 11 (Grades 9 and 10), all students in the English International Stream follow the two-year International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) course in eight to ten subjects. The Examination Boards determine the syllabus for each subject set and mark the public examination papers. Students at GSIS must study English Language and English Literature, Mathematics and German. They may select an additional four to six subjects, which must include one science, a second foreign language and one humanities subject.

GSIS offers the single-award sciences, allowing students to choose one, two or all three of the science disciplines. Students in our accelerated language programmes who take language IGCSEs early are able to continue their studies at AS or A level in Chinese and AS Level in German during these two years. They may also choose to take the Sprachdiplom DSD qualifications in German.

Our accelerated Mathematics programme leads students to sit an additional Further Pure Mathematics IGCSE exam at the end of Year 11.

German International Abitur (DIA)

The German International Abitur Diploma, known as Deutsches Internationales Abitur in German (DIA), is an internationally acclaimed pre-university curriculum and diploma that provides an academically exceptional and culturally rich multilingual education to students of all nationalities and backgrounds. It is approved, implemented and supervised by the Common Conference of the German Federal State School Ministries, the KMK.

The DIA builds on the strengths of the traditional Abitur curriculum and adds a larger multilingual component. At GSIS, several subjects are taught either bilingually or in English only.

In the final two years (Qualifikationsphase/Klasse 11 and 12), students pursue 11 subjects. Compulsory subjects are German, English, Maths, History, Geography, one or two foreign languages and two or three science subjects, plus

PE. In addition, they may choose either Ethics or Religious Education and Music or Arts. Grades range from 00 (insufficient) to 15 (excellent) points.

In Klasse 12 (Grade 12), five Abitur exams are taken (three written exams and two oral exams). German is always part of the exams, and the areas of Maths/Natural Sciences and Social Sciences must also be covered. Written exams are taken in February in three subjects including German. The mandatory oral exams are taken in late spring in two subjects, and are overseen by a German educational official. Up to 50% of the exams can be taken in English.

The final DIA diploma includes grades from the four semesters of the final two years of school, as well as the final written and oral exams. With a robust, internationally oriented and well-rounded curriculum of Languages, Sciences, Mathematics and Arts, the DIA prepares students to succeed at colleges and universities around the world.

ENRICHMENT & EXTRA-CURRICULAR OPPORTUNITIES

Enrichment and Community Service

At GSIS, extensive co-curricular activities and Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS) programmes provide students with a wide range of learning opportunities. Planning, implementing, and participation are highly valued and many activities are student-led.

Every year, German International Stream students participate in various renowned events. These include the Jugend Debattiert debate competition, the Mathecamp enrichment programme, and the bi-annual East Asian Games sports competition, where they collaborate with other German Schools Abroad.

Discovery Week

As a major aspect of our co-curricular education programme, Discovery Week is designed to challenge students to step outside their comfort zone and explore new experiences locally and internationally. Students are given the opportunity to go on cultural trips to Germany, along with community service projects in Laos, Cambodia, Thailand and the Philippines.
